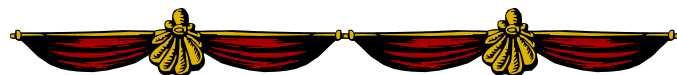
**THE HOLY SEASON OF ADVENT**

## Christmas Giving Tree

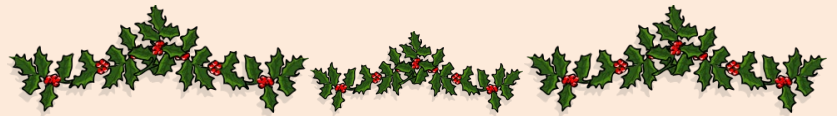
This Advent, we will once again have a

The Giving Tree will be in Bishop Di Marzio Hall during Advent.



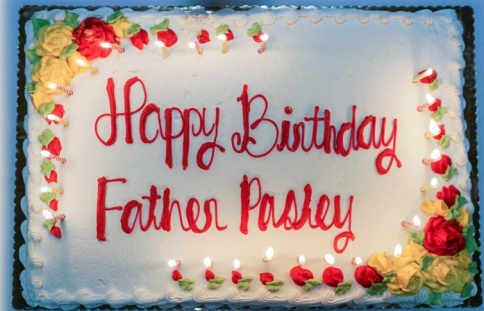
## Bulletin Deadlines

## Why do we celebrate the Mass of the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany on the Twenty-Fifth Sunday After Pentecost?

Easter is a Movable Feast and can be kept, according to the year in which it occurs, between March 22 and April 25. When it falls early the Septuagesima season encroaches on the Time After Epiphany, some Sundays of which are then kept between the Twenty-Third and the Last Sunday After Pentecost.

Starting with the Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost, the Mass Propers (The Introit, Gradual, Alleluia, Offertory, and Communion) remain the same until the First Sunday of Advent.

The Mass Readings, however, change according to the following:

If there are a total of **25** Sundays After Pentecost:

*The Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost is followed by the Readings and Prayers from the Mass of the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany and then the Last Sunday After Pentecost.*

If there are a total of **26** Sundays After Pentecost:

*The Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost is followed by the Readings and Prayers from the Mass of the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany; then the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany; and then the Last Sunday After Pentecost.*

If there are a total of **27** Sundays After Pentecost:

*The Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost is followed by the Readings and Prayers from the Mass of the Fourth Sunday After Epiphany; then the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany; then the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany; and then the Last Sunday After Pentecost.*


If there are a total of **28** Sundays After Pentecost:

*The Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost is followed by the Readings and Prayers from the Mass of the Third Sunday After Epiphany; then the Fourth Sunday After Epiphany; then the Fifth Sunday After Epiphany; then the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany; and then finally the Last Sunday After Pentecost.*

**This year, there are 27 Sundays After Pentecost. We will follow the schedule set forth above.**

## 2024 Liturgical Year

The Catholic Liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent and ends with the Last Sunday After Pentecost. Easter is a Movable Feast and can fall, according to the year in which it occurs, between March 22 and April 25. When it falls early, the Septuagesima Season encroaches on the Time After Epiphany, some Sundays of which are then kept and resumed between the Twenty-third and the Last Sunday after Pentecost.

There can be up to six Sundays after Epiphany.

There can be 24 to 28 Sundays after Pentecost.

The Time After Pentecost is determined by the date of Easter Sunday:

Ascension is 40 Days after Easter

Pentecost is 10 days after Ascension

Thus, the earlier Easter falls, the greater the number of Sundays After Pentecost (24, 25, 26, 27 or 28); the later Easter falls, the fewer Sundays after Pentecost.

*This year, there were 3 Sundays after Epiphany, Easter was on March 31, and there are 27 Sundays After Pentecost. We celebrate the Resumed Masses of the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Sundays After Epiphany. Advent begins on December 1. There are 4 Sundays of Advent and 3 full weeks of Advent this year. The Fourth Sunday of Advent is Sunday, December 22. The Vigil of the Nativity of Our Lord is on December 24. Christmas Day is Wednesday, December 25.*

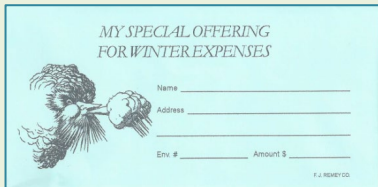
**HELP TO DEFRAY THE INCREASED WINTER EXPENSES AT MATER ECCLESIAE**

It is important that the form is filled in legibly and completely for our records. Once the form is completed and returned, Father Pasley will contact you to complete the preparation process and arrange a date for the Baptism.

Godparents who are not members of Mater Ecclesiae must have an official letter of eligibility from their home parish confirming that they are practicing Catholics, in good standing and are eligible to be sponsors. The letter should be sent directly to Mater Ecclesiae from their parish.

## Safety Notice

The safety of our parishioners in the Mater Ecclesiae parking lot requires everyone, whether drivers or pedestrians, to follow common sense safety practices.

### **DRIVERS:**

## Letters of Eligibility for Sponsors / Godparents at Baptism and Confirmation

If you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or Confirmation at another Catholic parish, they will require a Letter of Eligibility from Mater Ecclesiae.

To receive a Letter of Eligibility you must meet the following requirements:

1. You must be a registered member of Mater Ecclesiae in good standing.
2. You must be at least 16 years old.
3. You must have received the Sacraments of Initiation.
4. You must be a **practicing** Catholic and **eligible** to be a Godparent.

To receive a Letter of Eligibility, please contact The Rectory Office as soon as you are asked to be a sponsor. Do not wait until the last minute!

Please note that our voicemail system is sometimes unreliable. The most common problems we have when trying to retrieve phone messages are:

- Poor reception with phone static and background noise that obscures the caller’s voice making the message unintelligible.
- If the message is too long it can cut off before the caller leaves a callback number.
- If the caller does not speak clearly, the message can be indecipherable.

**An Email has many advantages:**

- It is a written record that is delivered quickly.
- It can be forwarded to the appropriate person.
- It can be archived for future reference.
- It allows for quick and efficient follow-up.

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan spoke about our commitment to a "Missionary" focus, and how "Missionary" should describe our approach to all pastoral ministry.

"A missionary brings women and men to Christ and to His church. A missionary respects people where they are. A missionary seeks to understand people from their side never imposing our side on them."

"The goal of a missionary is to attract others to Christ, to attract others to his church, never, never, never to turn them away or dismiss them."

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan also spoke about "Invitation." He invited the Cabrini sisters to return to the streets on which their saintly foundress walked and ministered. They said yes!


