THE HOLY SEASON OF ADVENT
THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT
GAUDETE SUNDAY

As we reach the Third Sunday of Advent, the color of the vestments in the Sanctuary is Rose; as is the third advent candle that we light. This is a day of joy, as today's Introit tells us,
"Rejoice in the Lord".

The time of waiting and anticipation is nearing an end; we are more than halfway through Advent, and the celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord is only days away!



Ember Days of Advent
December 20, 22, and 23



Ember Days are on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday following the First Sunday in Lent and Pentecost Sunday, during the third full week of September, and after the Third Sunday of Advent.

They are days of fasting for the special sanctification of the four seasons and for obtaining God's blessing on the clergy, for whose ordination the Ember Saturdays are specially set apart.

The Propers of the Masses reflect the Season in which they occur and include additional Lessons said before the Gospel.

O ANTIPHONS BEFORE CHRISTMAS
DECEMBER 17 - 23

The "O Antiphons" are the seven antiphons (responses sung in Gregorian Chant) that are chanted at Vespers (evening prayer) during the special period of Advent known as the Octave before Christmas, December 17 through 23. Each of "O Antiphons" begins with a different name or title for the Messiah:

- O Sapientia* (O Wisdom)
- O Adonai* (O Lord)
- O Radix Jesse* (O Root of Jesse)
- O Clavis David* (O Key of David)
- O Oriens* (O Rising Sun)
- O Rex Gentium* (O King of the Nations)
- O Emmanuel* (O Emmanuel)

Also of significance, each one refers to the prophecy of Isaiah of the coming of the Messiah. The first letters of the titles taken backwards form a Latin acrostic of "Ero Cras" which translates to "Tomorrow, I will come", mirroring the theme of the antiphons.





GAUDETE SUNDAY (THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT)

On this day the Church urges us to gladness in the middle of this time of expectation and penitence: the coming of Jesus approaches more and more. St. John, the holy precursor, announces to the Jews the coming of the Savior. "The Savior," he says to them, "lives already among us, though unknown. He will soon appear openly." Now is the time for fervent prayers and for imploring Jesus to remain with us by His mercy. Let us prepare the way for Him by repentance and by a worthy reception of the Sacraments. All the prayers of this Mass are filled with that which the Church wishes our souls to be possessed at the approach of the Savior.

It is also called "Gaudete Sunday" because the Introit begins with the joyful words "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Rose vestments are permitted in place of the purple worn during Advent. The only other Sunday permitting rose vestments is Laetare Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, a similar midway relaxation of the penitence of Lent. Traditionally, this is the only Sunday in Advent on which the organ may be heard at Mass, and flowers might be seen on the altar.

The Advent wreath, containing one candle for each of the four weeks of Advent, consists of three purple candles and one rose candle for the Third Week of Advent, Gaudete Sunday.

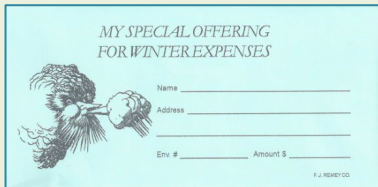
HELP TO DEFRAY THE INCREASED WINTER EXPENSES AT MATER ECCLESIAE

It is important that the form is filled in legibly and completely for our records. Once the form is completed and returned, Father Pasley will contact you to complete the preparation process and arrange a date for the Baptism.

Godparents who are not members of Mater Ecclesiae must have an official letter of eligibility from their home parish confirming that they are practicing Catholics, in good standing and are eligible to be sponsors. The letter should be sent directly to Mater Ecclesiae from their parish.

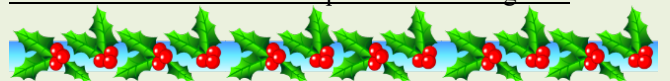


**Traditional Men's Silent Retreat

Safety Notice

Letters of Eligibility for Sponsors / Godparents at Baptism and Confirmation

If you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or Confirmation at another Catholic parish, they will require a Letter of Eligibility from Mater Ecclesiae.

To receive a Letter of Eligibility you must meet the following requirements:

1. You must be a registered member of Mater Ecclesiae in good standing.
2. You must be at least 16 years old.
3. You must have received the Sacraments of Initiation.
4. You must be a **practicing** Catholic and **eligible** to be a Godparent.

Please note that our voicemail system is sometimes unreliable. The most common problems we have when trying to retrieve phone messages are:

- Poor reception with phone static and background noise that obscures the caller’s voice making the message unintelligible.
- If the message is too long it can cut off before the caller leaves a callback number.
- If the caller does not speak clearly, the message can be indecipherable.

An Email has many advantages:

- It is a written record that is delivered quickly.
- It can be forwarded to the appropriate person.
- It can be archived for future reference.
- It allows for quick and efficient follow-up.

**Attention All CCD Parents—
Latin Prayers**

Father Pasley has introduced the requirement that our CCD students begin to learn the basic Catholic Prayers in Latin, so that the prayers will be mastered by the time they receive Confirmation.

Due to Covid limiting the CCD classes in 2020, we are reminding our parents that the Latin Prayers should be introduced and taught at home as part of the CCD Homeschool Program.

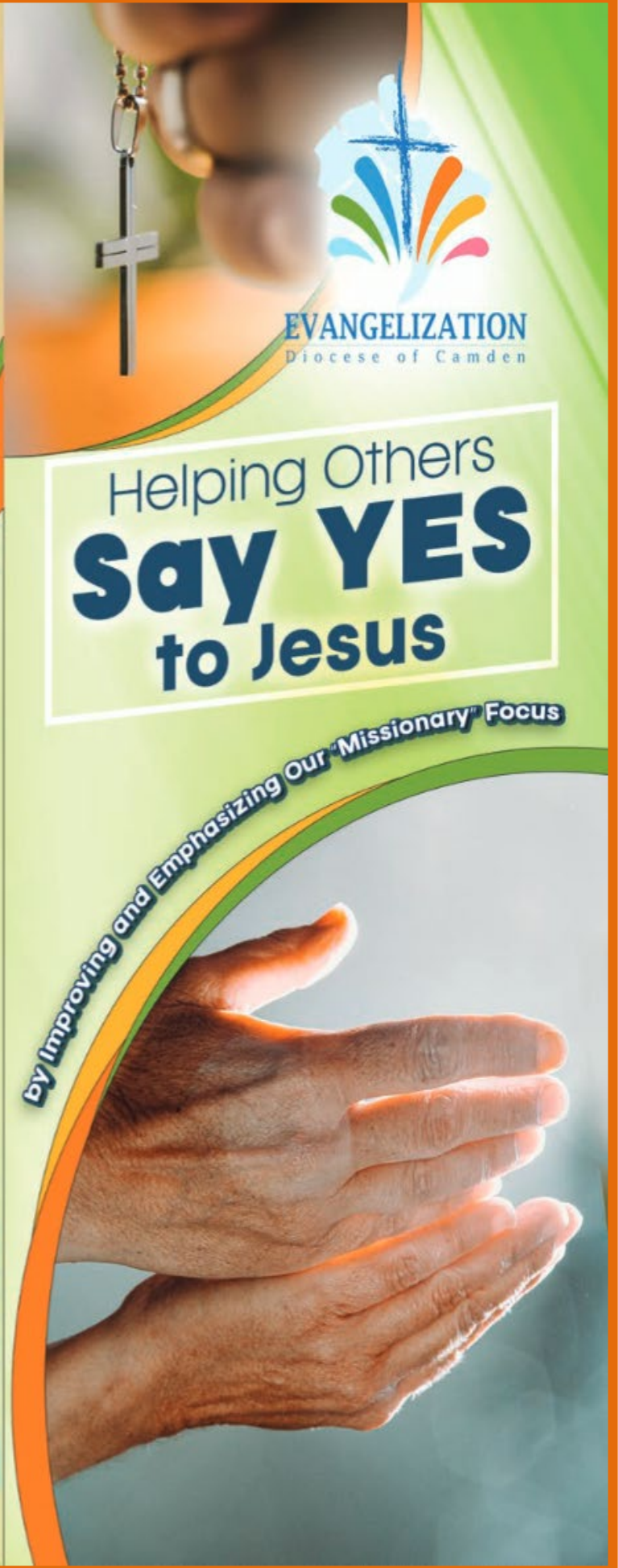

Is your parish Missionary focused?

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan spoke about our commitment to a "Missionary" focus, and how "Missionary" should describe our approach to all pastoral ministry.

"A missionary brings women and men to Christ and to His church. A missionary respects people where they are. A missionary seeks to understand people from their side never imposing our side on them."

"The goal of a missionary is to attract others to Christ, to attract others to his church, never, never, never to turn them away or dismiss them."

Are we consistently and effectively inviting people to say Yes to Jesus?

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan also spoke about "Invitation." He invited the Cabrini sisters to return to the streets on which their saintly foundress walked and ministered. They said yes!
