## Laetare Sunday - Rejoicel

On this special Sunday which falls in the middle of Lent, a small respite is permitted in the somber penitential season in order to encourage the faithful with the promise of the joy of the resurrection. Rose colored vestments are worn, flowers may adorn the altar and music is permitted. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is also known as "Laetare Sunday" from the opening prayers of the Introit of the Mass,

# "Laetare Jerusalem": "Rejoice, O Jerusalem".

It is sometimes called "Dominica de Rosa" (Rose Sunday) because of the color of the vestments and the tradition dating from the ancient Church in which the popes carried and blessed a golden rose on this day. The Golden Rose symbolizes Christ the King of all creation in resplendent glory. The blessed rose was sent to a special church, shrine, or individual favored by the pope. On Laetare Sunday, like Gaudete Sunday in Advent, we can rejoice in the proximity of the fulfillment of the Lord's promise.





At that time Iesus went over the Sea of Galilee, which is that of Tiberius: and a great multitude followed Him, because they saw the miracles which He did on them that were diseased. Jesus therefore went up into a mountain: and there He sat with His disciples. Now the Pasch, the festival day of the Jews, was near at hand. When Jesus therefore had lifted up His eyes, and seen that a very great multitude cometh to Him, He said to Philip: Whence shall we buy bread that these may eat? And this He said to try him: for He Himself knew what He would do. Philip answered Him: Two hundred pennyworth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one may take a little. One of His disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, saith to Him: There is a boy here that hath five barley loaves and two what fishes: but what are these among so many? Then Jesus said: Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. The men therefore sat down, in number about five thousand. And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks, He distributed to them that were set down: in like manner also of the fishes, as much as they would. And when they were filled, He said to His disciples: Gather up the fragments that remain, lest they be lost. They gathered up therefore, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which remained over and above to them that had eaten. Now those men, when they had seen what a miracle Jesus had done, said: This is of a truth the prophet that is to come into the world. Jesus therefore when He knew that they would come to take Him by force and make Him king, fled again into the mountain, Himself alone.



On the internet you can access www.divinumofficium.com . You could also save this on the screen of your IPhone. You would choose the 1960 rubrics, regular mode and English as a second language, unless of course you speak Magyar.

The other is an APP for IPhone or smart phone. In APPs on your phone, just search for **Breviarium Meum**. Download it and you are set to go. Click the settings symbol on the bottom left of your phone – parallel translation – English.

Turn off, Dominus vobiscum. Why?

When you say the Office alone you do not say V. Dominus Vobiscum R. Et cum Spiritu tuo, but V. Domine, exaudi orationem meum R. Et clamor meus ad te veniat.

## 1962 Discipline For Lenten Fasting

- 1. Every Day of Lent (except each Sunday and First Class Feast) is a day of fast.
- 2. Complete Abstinence and Fast are observed on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Holy Saturday morning Complete abstinence means no meat or soup or gravy made from meat. Fast means one full meal and two small meals. The two small meals added together should not equal the amount of the main meal. Fast also includes no eating between meals, but liquids, including milk and juice are allowed.
- 3. Partial Abstinence and Fast are observed on all other days not mentioned above Partial Abstinence means that you can eat meat at the principal meal only. The two small meals are meatless. Fast is the same as above including not eating between meals.
- 4. Beer and wine are allowed, but no hard alcohol.
- 5. Days of fast apply to those over 21 and under 59.
- 6. Laws of fasting and abstinence are not binding on those with medical conditions or those whose ability to work would be impaired.
- 7. Fasting and abstinence are not observed on Sundays and First Class Feasts. The Class I Feasts during Lent this year are Saint Joseph Day, March 19 and The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on March 25.
- 8. These rules no longer bind under pain of sin, unless one, after deep reflection, binds oneself in a promise to God. This should not be taken lightly.

## <u>Modern Discipline -</u> <u>Code of Canon Law 1983</u>

Fasting and complete abstinence are limited to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Complete abstinence (no meat, or soup or gravy made from meat) is obligatory for all Fridays of Lent. All over 14 must abstain. Fasting is obligatory between the ages of 18 and 59. These bare minimum rules are binding under pain of sin.

## **Lenten Corporal or External Practices**

- Take less of what you like and more of what you dislike at meals today.
- Take nothing to drink between meals.
- Do not use seasoning on your food today.
- Do not use any sweeteners with your food or drinks today.
- Avoid listening to the radio or iPod at all today.
- Take nothing to eat between meals today.
- Avoid any TV or videos; instead read the Passion of Christ in your Bible
- Take only one helping of each item at meals today.

## **Spiritual or Internal Fast Practices**

- Don't do any unnecessary talking; instead, say little aspirations throughout the day.
- Exercise your patience today in all things.
- Don't make any complaints today.
- Restrain any anger, and go out of your way to be kind to the person who caused your anger.
- Don't be distracted with someone else's business.
- Avoid any gossip today. Instead say an extra Rosary to overcome this great fault.
- When asked to do something extra do so with a joyful and pleasant attitude today.
- Speak in a pleasant tone to everyone today.
- Avoid using the phone today.
- Avoid all emails and favorite Blogs on the computer for a day.
- Tell the truth in all your dealings today.
- Avoid any vanity or self-seeking today.

# **Spiritual Practices:** Virtues & Good Works

- Attend Daily Mass / or at least read your Missal every day and make a spiritual Communion
- Attend Stations of the Cross/ Retreat days/ Parish Mission/ Eucharistic Adoration
- Say Vespers every Sunday at home
- Practice humility today in all your actions.
- Be generous today; help someone in need.
- Look for ways to be helpful throughout the day.
- Do a job that needs to be done without being asked.
  Be courageous; walk away from any impure situations
- Be courageous; walk away from any impure situations today.
- Don't be at all idle today. Always be doing something for others or for your spiritual growth.
- Go out of your way today to help or talk to someone who is usually difficult.
- Volunteer for an extra job today.
- Say an extra Rosary today for the conversion of a sinner.
- Make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament.
- Visit someone who is sick or lonesome today. Offer to say the Rosary with them.
- Make a pledge to the House of Charity and follow through with it.



## To Schedule a Baptism

Parishioners who wish to schedule a Baptism should contact the Rectory Office by email, secretary@materecclesiae.org or 856-753-3408.

Please contact the Rectory well in advance so that preparations can be arranged.

When you contact the office, we will email you a PDF of our Baptismal Register Form, which details all of the information needed for the Sacramental Records. It is important that the form is filled in legibly and completely for our records. Once the form is completed and returned, Father Pasley will contact you to complete the preparation process and arrange a date for the Baptism.

Godparents who are not members of Mater Ecclesiae must have an official letter of eligibility from their home parish confirming that they are practicing Catholics, in good standing and are eligible to be sponsors. The letter should be sent directly to Mater Ecclesiae from their parish.



## Letters of Eligibility for Sponsors / Godparents at Baptism and Confirmation

If you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or Confirmation at another Catholic parish, they will require a Letter of Eligibility from Mater Ecclesiae.

To receive a Letter of Eligibility you must meet the following requirements:

- 1. You must be a registered member of Mater Ecclesiae in good standing.
- 2. You must be at least 16 years old.
- 3. You must have received the Sacraments of Initiation.
- 4. You must be a <u>practicing</u> Catholic and eligible to be a Godparent.

- > If the message is too long it can cut off before the caller leaves a callback number.
- > If the caller does not speak clearly, the message can be indecipherable.

- It can be forwarded to the appropriate person.
- It can be archived for future reference.
- > It allows for quick and efficient follow-up.

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan spoke about our commitment to a "Missionary" focus, and how "Missionary" should describe our approach to all pastoral ministry.

"A missionary brings women and men to Christ and to His church. A missionary respects people where they are. A missionary seeks to understand people from their side never imposing our side on them."

"The goal of a missionary is to attract others to Christ, to attract others to his church, never, never, never to turn them away or dismiss them."

At the 2024 Chrism Mass, Bishop Sullivan also spoke about "Invitation." He invited the Cabrini sisters to return to the streets on which their saintly foundress walked and ministered. They said yes!


